

Controller of Personal Data: Cosmos Networking Community (Club)
(hereinafter as „**Group**“)

Group, as the Controller of Personal Data, processes the personal data of persons registered on the website www.c-n-c.net (hereinafter as „**Website**“) in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC ('**GDPR**').

Due to the fact that we strive for the greatest possible **transparency**, we would like to inform you about the rights derive for you from GDPR.

The legal basis for processing your personal data is registration on the Website. **The purpose** for which your personal data are processed is to inform registered members about events of our Cosmos Networking Community (Club) (the "**Group**"), about social networks of the Group (eg Facebook, Instagram, Youtube, etc.) or about possible applications of the Group (for the purposes of the communication of the Group) which could be installed to mobile phones, tablets, and other electronic devices supporting this technology. Your data will be provided to third parties only exceptionally (in particular the basic data type such as e-mail, first name and surname) and in particular for the purpose of your registration on social networks on which our Group is located, or for the purpose of downloading and registration on third party applications where our Group is located, mainly for the purpose of internal communication of our Group.

Your personal information is processed for the time of existence of the Group, or until you exercise any of your GDPR rights below.

Your fundamental rights under the GDPR are as follows:

A. The right of access:

1. You have the right to obtain from the us confirmation as to whether or not personal data concerning you are being processed, and, where that is the case, access to the personal data and the following information:
 - a) the purposes of the processing;
 - b) the categories of personal data concerned;
 - c) the recipients or categories of recipient to whom the personal data have been or will be disclosed, in particular recipients in third countries or international organisations;
 - d) where possible, the envisaged period for which the personal data will be stored, or, if not possible, the criteria used to determine that period;
 - e) the existence of the right to request from the us rectification or erasure of personal data or restriction of processing of personal data concerning the data subject or to object to such processing;
 - f) the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority;
 - g) where the personal data are not collected from the data subject, any available information as to their source;

2. If personal data will be in future transferred to a third country or to an international organisation, you will have the right to be informed of the appropriate safeguards pursuant to Article 46 of GDPR relating to the transfer.
3. We shall provide a copy of the personal data undergoing processing.²For any further copies requested by you, we may charge a reasonable fee based on administrative costs.³Where you make the request by electronic means, and unless otherwise requested by you, the information shall be provided in a commonly used electronic form.
4. The right to obtain a copy referred to in paragraph 3 shall not adversely affect the rights and freedoms of others.

B. Right to rectification:

1. You have the right to obtain from us without undue delay the rectification of inaccurate personal data concerning you.²Taking into account the purposes of the processing, you have the right to have incomplete personal data completed, including by means of providing a supplementary statement.

C. Right to erasure ('right to be forgotten')

1. You have the right to obtain from us the erasure of personal data without undue delay and we have the obligation to erase personal data without undue delay where one of the following grounds applies:
 - a) the personal data are no longer necessary in relation to the purposes for which they were collected or otherwise processed;
 - b) the data subject withdraws consent on which the processing is based according to point (a) of Article 6(1) GDPR, or point (a) of Article 9(2) GDPR, and where there is no other legal ground for the processing;
 - c) the data subject objects to the processing pursuant to Article 21(1) GDPR and there are no overriding legitimate grounds for the processing, or the data subject objects to the processing pursuant to Article 21(2) GDPR;
 - d) the personal data have been unlawfully processed;
 - e) the personal data have to be erased for compliance with a legal obligation in Union or Member State law to which we are subject;
 - f) the personal data have been collected in relation to the offer of information society services referred to in Article 8(1) GDPR.
2. Where we made the personal data public and is obliged pursuant to paragraph 1 to erase the personal data, we, taking account of available technology and the cost of implementation, shall take reasonable steps, including technical measures, to inform other controllers which are processing the personal data that the data subject has requested the erasure by such controllers of any links to, or copy or replication of, those personal data.
3. Paragraphs 1 and 2 shall not apply to the extent that processing is necessary:
 - a) for exercising the right of freedom of expression and information;

- b) for compliance with a legal obligation which requires processing by Union or Member State law to which we are subject or for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority;
- c) for reasons of public interest in the area of public health in accordance with points (h) and (i) of Article 9(2) GDPR as well as Article 9(3) GDPR;
- d) for archiving purposes in the public interest, scientific or historical research purposes or statistical purposes in accordance with Article 89(1) GDPR in so far as the right referred to in paragraph 1 is likely to render impossible or seriously impair the achievement of the objectives of that processing; or
- e) for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

D. Right to restriction of processing

1. You have the right to obtain from us restriction of processing where one of the following applies:
 - a) the accuracy of the personal data is contested by you, for a period enabling us to verify the accuracy of the personal data;
 - b) the processing is unlawful and the data subject opposes the erasure of the personal data and requests the restriction of their use instead;
 - c) we no longer need the personal data for the purposes of the processing, but they are required by the data subject for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims;
 - d) you have objected to processing pursuant to Article 21(1) GDPR pending the verification whether the legitimate grounds of the controller override those of the data subject.
2. Where processing has been restricted under paragraph 1, such personal data will, with the exception of storage, only be processed with your consent or for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims or for the protection of the rights of another natural or legal person or for reasons of important public interest of the Union or of a Member State.
3. If you obtained restriction of processing pursuant to paragraph 1, you will be informed by us before the restriction of processing is lifted.

E. Right to object

1. You have the right to object, on grounds relating to your particular situation, at any time to processing of personal data which is based on point (e) or (f) of Article 6(1) GDPR, including profiling based on those provisions. We shall no longer process the personal data unless we demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing which override the interests, rights and freedoms of the data subject or for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

2. Where personal data are processed for direct marketing purposes, you have the right to object at any time to processing of personal data concerning him or her for such marketing, which includes profiling to the extent that it is related to such direct marketing.
3. Where you object to processing for direct marketing purposes, the personal data shall no longer be processed for such purposes.
4. In the context of the use of information society services, and notwithstanding Directive 2002/58/EC, you may exercise your right to object by automated means using technical specifications.
5. Where personal data will be processed for scientific or historical research purposes or statistical purposes pursuant to Article 89(1) GDPR, you, on grounds relating to particular situation, shall have the right to object to processing of personal data, unless the processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out for reasons of public interest.

F. Right to data portability

1. You have the right to receive the personal data concerning you, which you provided to us, in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format and have the right to transmit those data to another controller without hindrance from us, where:
 - a) the processing is based on consent pursuant to point (a) of Article 6(1) GDPR or point (a) of Article 9(2) GDPR or on a contract pursuant to point (b) of Article 6(1) GDPR; and
 - b) the processing is carried out by automated means.
2. In exercising your right to data portability pursuant to paragraph 1, you have the right to have the personal data transmitted directly from one controller to another, where technically feasible.
3. The exercise of the right referred to in paragraph 1 of this Article shall be without prejudice to Article 17 GDPR. That right shall not apply to processing necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority.
4. The right referred to in paragraph 1 shall not adversely affect the rights and freedoms of others.
